## **COUNCIL PRESIDENT**

We had a council meeting last night and we opened with John 13:34-35. <sup>34</sup> I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. <sup>35</sup> By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. This is a great reminder for us of what Jesus wants us to do in regards to each other.

We discussed change and how difficult it may be for some people, but sometimes we really need to make decisions for the congregation that may turn out to be positive change. The one change we are looking at doing for a short period of time was summer services. Our summer services are not always well attended, so we have discussed some ideas. The one idea we kept returning to was to have one combined service on Sunday morning. There are two reasons for this small change in the summer. One reason is to give us a chance to worship together as the Body of Christ. We have three services and many members don't routinely engage with each other in a meaningful manner. Another is cost savings. Having one service on Sunday will cut down on the amount of time we need to run the Air Conditioning units. On a typical Sunday, the units will run for nearly six hours to cool the church, as opposed to two hours for one combined service. A motion was made at council and passed unanimously to do a trail run of one service on Sunday in the summer. We agreed that we would have one service on Sunday June 18<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. The service will be 9:30am on those dates and will include communion. The Saturday evening service will remain as usual!

We continue to discuss the church's financial situation every council meeting. The Stewardship Committee has been extremely effective at tracking and graphing our intake of funds and output. Unfortunately, our incoming funds continue to be lacking. This has led to withdrawing funds routinely from our reserves. As a result of our difficulties, we will continue to look at ways to cut costs and we invite members of the church to be active participants. Not just suggest things, make time and attend a council meeting to present an idea. If you aren't good with speaking to a group, do as Moses did and have your brother do it, or sister, or friend. Cost cutting may include cutting paper usage with electronic bulletins, online newsletter instead of mail delivery, combined services during certain times of the year, etc. We must also balance our need to continue to minister as we have and develop new ministries.

We welcome constructive feedback on anything we decide on in council. We prefer it be in a constructive and loving manner and not outright criticism. We must always keep ourselves reminder of what we are to be doing, and that is fulfilling our mission from God. We cannot fulfill that mission from God. We cannot fulfill that mission if we are negative and critical of each other. We must do as Jesus commanded us to do and that is love one another.






## YOUTH GROUP
