This is the second in a series of articles designed to give members of our congregation important facts about our Gift Acceptance Policy and how it relates to our new Mission Endowment Fund.

Trinity's Stewardship Committee worked diligently for three years to create a Mission Endowment Fund that has now been in place a little more than a year. *I consider this one of the most visionary things that has happened during my 40 years as a member of our church.*

For the handful of our members who have been questioning the need for a Mission Endowment and wondering why we just can't spend the \$22,000+ in gifts we've received so far to pay bills at Trinity, the opening paragraph of the Gift Acceptance Policy clearly explains the endowment's purpose.

It says, "As the baptized people of God, we are called to be faithful stewards of all gifts God has entrusted to us. This responsibility includes the use, management, and distribution of the accumulated, appreciated, and inherited assets that make up our net worth.

"Just as we give for the Lord's work from our income annually, we are encouraged to give for the Lord's work from our *bequeathed assets*, as well. These special legacy gifts are expressions of generosity that are given with the hope of being a *blessing to the work of God beyond our lifetime* and to inspire and encourage all God's people to experience the 'grace of giving.""

In my 25 years as executive director of the Altoona Area School District Foundation, I learned that people like the idea of leaving an estate gift that will impact an organization forever – not used on *once and done projects* like fixing a furnace, paying a bill and the like. When I retired in 2011, the endowed funds I left behind exceeded \$1 million. Of this I am quite proud.

As was stated in the last Mission Endowment quarterly report (June '19 *Orbit*), no one from Trinity actively solicited estate gifts or contributions for our new endowment. Those who made that commitment cherished the fact that their gift would impact our ministries forever.

Trinity Memorial Gift Program

Do you know how Trinity's memorial gift program works?

It's been a few months since we reminded our members about Trinity's memorial gift program that has been flourishing for more than ten years.

In case you've forgotten how the program works or you are one of our newer members, we are happy to present a few reminders about this very successful program.

- Upon the passing of a friend or relative, whether they attended Trinity or not, a person can make a gift *in any amount* in that person's name instead of sending flowers.
- The donor *always* receives a thank you letter for the gift which also serves as a receipt.
- The family of the deceased *always* receives a complete list of donors so they can send thank you cards if they so desire. *The amount given by each donor is never shared.*
- Donor names are also recorded in the Book of Remembrance located in the back corner of the sanctuary. They are also listed in our newsletter.
- Memorial donations do not have to be earmarked for a special purpose. All money received into the Memorial Fund is used for special projects in and around the church.
- Our memorial gift envelopes are always available in the back of the sanctuary.
