Treasurer's Report

Ralph presented the report as written. He stated that all is up to date except for the payroll. There will be \$1,422.55 left after payroll. The federal and state taxes are yet to be paid. He did check on the taxes for the other building. Since it is not attached to the church, it is taxable. Question was asked if Bovard was finished with the furnace and the bill was paid. Linda H. said the furnace is still not working. Pastor will call to check on this. Adam made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Tom seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Pastor's report was presented as written.

Committee Reports

Committee reports were presented as written.

Adam said that the lights were in at the Theatre building. Next was the dry wall and ceiling, then paint. He also reported that the float in the Hollidaysburg Christmas Parade won 2nd place. December 5 they will participate in the Altoona Christmas Parade.

Geri gave a report on the Youth Gathering in State College. She said it was a mini version of the trip to Houston and the kids had an awesome time. They learned a lot and connected with old friends and made new ones. Their next project will be Holiday Helpers on December 13. They will babysit children for \$5.00 while parents can go out and shop. They will also show the movie: Polar Express. December 22 at the 10:45 service will be the children's Christmas Pageant.

Old Business

Fall Banquet: we discussed that 120 tickets were sold and not that many came. The ticket sale is not a fund raiser. The tickets cost \$13.00 and we sold them for \$8.00. We lost money on the event. Next year we may raise the price of the tickets. We will also check to get another bid to see if someone else is cheaper.

Committee members: we discussed the different committees and how to get people involved. Geri will write a letter to put in the Orbit to increase committee members.

Gift Acceptance Policy: John discussed the importance of having an Endowment Fund. It is to have money available to use for projects with out touching the principal. Right now, we have \$22,863.11. We need to have \$25,000.00 to invest. And it needs to be \$27,000.00 because 10% needs to go to ELCA for mission funds. Tom drew up a concise explanation of the Gift Acceptance Policy. This is good for the general congregation. However, the formal Policy needs to be kept in the bylaws.

Adam made a motion to change the amount of money divided between Endowment and General funds to 50/50. Judy seconded the motion. Following discussion motion passed with 2 opposed and 1 abstain. We will finalize the paper next month.

Thanks to Tom for coordinating the pew marker memorials. We have reached a profit of \$300.00.

New Business

Adam asked if the church was willing to sponsor a Girl Scout Troop. They are being asked to leave the church they are currently using. There are 40 girls and 7 adults.

Questions were raised why they are leaving the other church. Adam will get more details for next meeting. Ralph will check on our insurance coverage for outside groups.

Bill brought up that the facia on the 5th Avenue side is off. Bryan George quoted \$385.00 to take it off and restore it. Adam made a motion to accept the bid. Geri seconded the motion.

Linda H. reported that the congregational meeting went well. There were many suggestions from the congregation.
