On March 17th we will celebrate St.Patrick's Day. It is a day that we are all a little bit Irish. There are many traditions that go along with St. Patrick's Day, green beer, wearing of the green, parades etc., but I thought we would take a look at the real person of St. Patrick. St. Patrick has always been one to be known for his innovative methods of converting the pagans to Christianity. It is also said that he came up with the Celtic Cross by putting the circle of the sun, something the pagans worshiped in the cross thus overlapping the two. The meeting was called to order by President, Sharon Kutz.

Absent

Pastor led us with prayer.

Minutes from last meeting.

Minutes from January 28 were read. Adam made a motion to approve the minutes. Tom seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Ralph presented the report as written. He stated that everything is up to date but payroll. The taxes are due and Pastor's health insurance increased from \$1,809.00 to \$1847.00. Ralph will have to withdraw \$8,457.50 from reserves to pay Synod for benevolence. John questioned whether the money paid to Synod reflected expenses for last year or 2020. It will go on 2020. Adam asked that 2018 would be reported on 2019.

Ralph reported that last year's income was \$242,054.81 and the expenses were \$239,793.65 leaving a profit of \$2,261.16. Ralph reported that he has Quick Book 2012 on his computer and will set up 2020. Tom S. will be helping with the set up. We discussed where to set up an office for the computer for finances. Ideas were – Situation room, upstairs office, lounge – Tom suggested that the computer be downstairs near the router, the lounge. Ralph reported that there is \$23,090.78 in the Endowment Fund. We need \$27,000.00 to invest. Bill made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Tom seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Pastor Hess' Report

Pastor's report was presented as written. Ralph commended Pastor on a wonderful service for the funeral of Shannon. He said the sermon was beautiful.

Committee Reports

Committee reports were presented as written.

Sharon asked that each Council member be a part of a committee. We went around the table and volunteered for committees. (See attached sheet.)

Geri discussed more about the Youth trip and ideas for fundraisers.

Old Business

Souper Bowl Party – thanks to Angela Counterman for a wonderful event. There were 17 different kinds of soup and 50 + people attended. Everyone had a great time.

Girl Scout Troop – Adam did meet with the leader to get the key.

New Business

Geri will write an article for the Orbit for the committees.

Pastor requested the surveys for the Synod. Mail them in or bring them to the office.

Ralph reminded everyone that he needs a copy of the Camp Sequanota applications so he can turn them in to the Cook Fund.




