Following discussion, we had a paper vote to close Christmas Eve and Christmas Day or stay open. The vote was 11 to close and 1 stay open. We will not have services Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. Pastor will live stream on Facebook Christmas Eve.

We then discussed staying closed for the rest of the Sundays. Following discussion, Nancy made a motion to close until the first week in February. Linda seconded the motion. Motion passed. Council will meet the fourth Tuesday in January and will reevaluate the situation.
