I love doing them, talking to the families, shopping, setting up, cooking, cleaning up, but mostly the interaction with my faithful crew. Everyone knows what their job is and we never have to worry if it's done right, it always is. They need to be commended!

The only drawback is trying not to offend someone by not asking for their help for each dinner. We have many cake makers so I try to not pick the same ones every time, it's not that we don't want your desserts. We have had only three dinners in the last year and a half because of Covid. So for only one month I needed people to work so not many have been called upon to help, and only so many people fit in a kitchen. If you feel neglected I'm sorry, it's not intentional. I put a volunteer list for many positions in the Orbit and I got back ONE reply. Many names that I have are no longer able to work or have other plans but they don't tell me to take them off the list or they don't want to do it that day, that's why I asked for an update.

Is anyone interested in taking this over? If yes, contact me or Pastor. I am more than willing to get you started. It's time consuming and tiring but so worth it when you sit back and sigh when it's over.

Day 1 - Speak with one or more family members about

arrangements and what they want, and help them estimate attendance, not easy for them. Plan the menu, guide them through this process.

Day 2 - go shopping, take groceries to church and prepare as much as possible for the next day. Tables need to be set, tablecloths and silverware are placed on the tables, seating is counted to be sure we don't run out of space, we always contemplate a backup plan.

Day 3 - Start the actual preparation of food, praying the count isn't off and there is enough food for everyone. Our ovens don't always accommodate what we need to put in them so rotation is always important, everything needs to be done and hot at the same time. Pretty much the workers have their own specialty so they just get down to business and can be counted on to do an amazing job. When day 3 guests are done chatting, healing and bonding the cleanup begins.

This is a lot of work, our legs are getting old. but so gratifying. you must be available at all times, if you have something planned your schedule needs to be changed, funeral dinners are top priority.

If you're interested please let us know and we will not let you on your own the first time.
