The bill for Roto Rooter has been paid and will come out of the Disaster Relief Fund.

We discussed bids for the air conditioner in Trinity Hall. We received a bid of \$7,000.00 from Bovard. We will get other bids before going ahead.

Judy made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as presented. John seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### Pastor Hess' Report

Presented as written. She stated that the fall programs are up and running, Sunday school, Bible study, youth programs and conference meetings. She will be on vacation from October 15-25. Pastor Jamie Olsen will be on call. Pastor Ralph Hamer will cover services October 16-17 and Peggy Thatcher will cover October 23-24. She also added the Senior Youth group will hold a Haunted House on October 23, following the Saturday evening service.

#### **Committee Reports**

Finance – Barb presented the 2022 budget from the Finance committee. Please look over the budget and come with questions, comments for next month's meeting. The budget was down \$10,000.00 from last year. Salaries have been frozen again but there will be increases for taxes and Pastor's benefits.

Social Ministry – presented as written. They will be working to increase attendance. They discussed a fund raiser to help with the Disaster Relief Fund.

Stewardship – John said that we received between \$500.00 and \$600.00 for the Mountain Lion Backpack program. He discussed the November Thank Offering with the thought of using it to help with the Disaster Relief Fund.

#### **Old Business**

Update on the small urinal – Rick will remove the urinal.

Sanctuary wall – John said Sandy has yet to polyurethane the wall and finish the rail cap and it will be finished.

#### **New Business**

Water damage – the basement was flooded with water and mud. We believe it may have been the result of the opening in the sidewalk from the Gas company. They deny any responsibility because they are far enough away from the foundation. We discussed filing suit and decided to consult with our solicitor before making any decisions. Judy made a motion to consult with our solicitor, Katie Mauk. Linda seconded the motion. Motion passed. Pastor will call and set up a meeting.

Ken asked about the light that keeps flickering in the sanctuary. He will investigate to see what lights need replaced.

**Endowment-** John questioned why the entire amount was not deposited into the Endowment. Pastor said we put \$25,000.00 in to begin and had to keep some in the checking account to keep it open. We also kept a cushion to help with the next deposit of \$2,000.00.

He also asked if Memorial gifts were to be split 50/50 with the Endowment. Memorial gifts go strictly to the Memorial Fund. The wishes of the donor come first. Any dollar amount that is not earmarked are split 50/50 with the Endowment and the general fund.

**Orbit**- Following discussion about the delay in receiving the Orbit, it was decided to set a date for submissions. Barb made a motion that the Orbit submission deadline will be the 24<sup>th</sup> of every month with the previous month's minutes included. Sharon seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**Amazon Smile Program**- John discussed this program. When checking out on Amazon, you can donate to your charity. Trinity is already signed up as a charity. John will write a description for the Orbit. This is an easy way to get some extra money at no cost to the church or the consumer.

The meeting was then adjourned.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.





### **Trinity Disaster Relief Fund**

During the storm caused by Tropical storm Ida on August 29-31 the church incurred flooding in the basement. This flooding caused significant damage to our preschool room as well as the hallway and the lounge.

The water was so bad it flowed into Trinity Hall. There was mud and silt everywhere. In order to clean up the flooding and the standing water ServPro was contacted. We have incurred bills totaling over \$13,000 for clean up and damage done.

Our insurance will not cover the damage because we did not have water back up coverage or flood coverage (we do now, lesson learned the hard way) and are looking into recouping some of the burden from the Gas company as we feel the water came directly to the church from work they are doing on the sidewalk and roadway. With all that being said, we have been taking up special offerings to help with this unfortunate matter.

If you would like to help with the cost of the clean up please designate any funds you may send in to the "Disaster relief fund" or "Flooding fund". If we all pull together we can get these bills paid without having to go to our savings.

Thank you so much for your continued support of the ministries here at Trinity and for your attention to this matter.
