Many of you may be thinking, "why are we reading a Good Friday/Easter passage in October"? It is because one cannot find a better Halloween passage than the one quoted above. It could be the setting or opening lines of a horror movie. Tombs are opened and the dead are raised to walk around Jerusalem. Sounds to me like the movie, "Night of the Living Dead." At Halloween we are fascinated with dressing up, the older we get the scarier we get. For some reason we enjoy scaring each other and being scared. Even in the scripture passage it says that the centurion and others were terrified, and if we leave the passage here it would be terrifying. But the passage ends with the declaration, "Truly this man was God's Son." Just like we do not stay in Halloween we move on to All Saints Day the very next day. We live in the resurrection so that the events of Good Friday are not the final word. Those bodies that came out of the tombs of Jerusalem were not Zombies, they were the raised saints, they are not the living dead, they are simply the living in Christ. Halloween can be a fun holiday to celebrate, but we do not stay there, we move on to All Saints Day were we proclaim that, "Truly this man was God's Son." All Saints Day reminds us that we are saved in Christ, not doomed zombies or ghosts, or skeletons. We will one day walk out of our tombs, raised saints of God.

FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Just to update the congregation on our progress towards replacing the air conditioning in the sanctuary.

To date Trinity has only received 2 bids towards this project. Prudence would suggest that we receive at least one more bid. Several companies have declined to bid on replacing the existing system due to problems they have encountered with similar projects. One company has bid on replacing the existing system. The second bid is to place 4 mini-splits in the sanctuary, as this company feels that replacing the existing system would be too costly.

For those who don't know what mini-splits are (I certainly didn't before all of this began), these are units like the one we recently installed in Trinity Hall. Other companies have suggested we would need 6 of these mini-splits in the sanctuary.

One thing to remember is that these mini-splits would be mounted on the inner walls of the sanctuary, which would significantly change the appearance of our worship space. The dilemma that Council is faced with before deciding which proposal to present to the congregation for approval is the fact that the majority of firms that we have consulted feel that replacing our existing equipment with a system very much like it is not feasible, while another feels that this can be done.

Council is anxious to move forward with this project, but wants to ensure that we are taking a course of action that will serve the intended purpose on a long-term basis and do so at a reasonable cost. We will continue to explore these options, but see no need to rush headlong into action, especially since the summer season is ending.
