# **Trinity Council President**

#### FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

I'll open this column with a quote from one of my favorite musicals "West Side Story" "Boy, boy, crazy boy, Stay cool boy.

Yes, a bid from Johnston Heating, Plumbing, and Air Conditioning was approved at the congregational meeting the weekend of April 15-16. The unit has been ordered and should be here in the next few weeks. After that, we'll be on Johnston's schedule and hopefully will have our new air conditioning system in place before we experience many warm days.

It was a joy to celebrate the Resurrection on April 8-9. The weather was beautiful, and Pastor Eli's infamous allergies didn't appear to flare up as much as past years.

Andrew Arnold, of Gwin, Dobson, and Foreman attended the March 28 Council meeting to report on his findings when he inspected Trinity's building. Since our roof was replaced and is relatively new, and our air conditioning is about to be replaced, he reported favorably on those areas. These are two big concerns, especially in older buildings such as Trinity. His first concern is to upgrade the electrical system. We still have ceramic knob and tube wiring in older sections of the church. While this does not pose any immediate danger, this type of wiring has not been used since the 1950's. It does not allow for a ground wire, which explains any two-prong receptacles in areas of the building. Eventually, this type of wiring deteriorates and can be a fire hazard. Church Council will begin the process of consulting with electricians to update this outdated wiring. Secondly, our bathrooms in the basement are not ADA compliant. He admits upgrading them will be difficult due to space limitations. Finally, he suggests tying our storm water drains into the storm system when the city replaces that system. He thinks any action on the part of the city is at least 5 years away. When we contacted Mr. Arnold, his fee for this inspection was \$150.00. However, he performed this inspection FREE OF CHARGE. We thank him for his time and expertise.

Summer is fast approaching and financial aid from the Cook fund is available for Trinity youth to attend Camp Sequanota. Applications are available on the table at the rear of the sanctuary or from the Church office. Just a reminder that May 31 is the final date that applications can be accepted. Please see a detailed description of the application process elsewhere in this issue.

Minutes from last meeting. Minutes from the February meeting were read. Ken made a motion to accept the minutes. Barb seconded the motion. Motion passed. **Engineer Report** Andrew Arnold from Gwin, Dobson, Foreman Engineer conducted an inspection of the church building in February. He said that the church was in pretty good condition. We updated the roof and installed HVAC and are having it repaired. He passed out two handouts which listed his recommendations. First would be to upgrade the electrical. There are still knob and tube wiring in the older section of the church. He also recommended updating the lighting with more efficient lighting. The next recommendation would be to comply with the ADA recommendations. This would involve restroom facilities, door widths and clearances and handrail/guard rail replacement. Last would be to address the stormwater by tying it into the storm system. This could be done when the city replaces the storm system, and they are not doing anything for the next five years. Council thanked Mr. Arnold for his inspection and recommendations. The cost of the inspection was \$150.00. Mr. Arnold said there would be no charge. **Treasurer's Report** Ralph reported that all is up to date. We received \$31,000.00 from Peggy Peterman's Estate. Half will go into the general fund and half into the Endowment. The question from last month concerning the Brent Cogan bill was a balance that was paid from a past bill Ralph discussed returning to playing the organ. He plans on talking with Cindy to discuss filling in for her when she needs a Saturday off. Judy made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Jim seconded the motion. Motion passed. **Pastor Hess' Report** Pastor's report was presented as written. She has been busy with Lenten worship and Easter preparation. She has been visiting the shut-ins and has evening meetings for counseling, baptism and wedding preparations. Lenten services are going well and so is Bible study and Adult Sunday School. Geri made a motion to approve Pastor's report. Barb seconded. Motion passed. **Committee Reports**

Barb seconded. Motion passed.



Barb made a motion to accept Brian Johnston to repair the air conditioning. Geri seconded the motion. Motion passed. This will be brought to the congregation for approval. The congregational meeting will be the weekend of April 15, 16. **Offering Envelopes** We will order these soon. Payment for this years envelopes must accompany the order. Ladies Restroom There continues to be a sewer odor from the drain. Following discussion it was recommended that the drain needs to be flushed weekly. We will ask Adam to do this weekly. 
KUDOS TO EVERYONE



## **Trinity Church Special Congregational Meeting**

Special Congregational Meeting

4-15-16-2023 6:30 Service President, John Ebersole opened the meeting. He discussed the process Council went through to get 3 bids for the repair of the air conditioning in the sanctuary. The bids were: Rabenstein \$14,250.00, Johnston \$20,000.00, and Signature Services \$23,495. Council rejected the bid by Signature because it was to install 4 mini splits (what is in Trinity Hall) in the sanctuary. This would alter the look of the sanctuary and may effect the integrity of the stained-glass windows. Council decided to propose accepting the bid by Johnston because it included replacing the lines from inside to outside using copper to accommodate the new refrigerant. Rabenstein did not include replacing the lines in his bid. Council made a motion to accept the bid from Brian Johnston. Jim Frederick seconded the motion. John then asked for questions and discussion. Ouestions: Do we have to monies to pay for this? We received a bequest from the estate of Peggy Peterman for \$31,000.00. Half will go to the general fund and half to the Endowment. We have also received several gifts to the church to go to the air conditioning. John also plans to use the next Thank Offerings to collect for the project. Is it a local company? Yes. Do we have references on Johnston? We can ask for those before the work is done. Will we get a maintenance agreement? Yes. How long will it take? As soon as we get approval Johnston could order the parts which could take two weeks. Then he could put us on the schedule. Is Johnston bonded? He is commercial and residential in the city of Altoona, so yes, he is bonded. What is the life expectancy of the air conditioner? We have had the original one for 20 years without maintenance. Hopefully, with maintenance we should get another 20 years. Would we get a heat pump? We can ask and see how much extra that would cost. It would save on the gas bill in the winter. Following discussion a vote by hand was taken.

### **Trinity Camp Sequanota**

#### APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL AID FOR CAMP SEQUANOTA

Parents/guardians of children/youth wishing to attend a one-week session at Camp Sequanota may apply for financial aid.

Since 1986, the Dorothy Baird Cook Memorial Fund has been used to provide full or partial assistance to children from Trinity Lutheran Church with financial need who wish to attend Camp Sequanota.

After reviewing the summer camp schedule. Parents/guardians who wish to request aid from the Cook Fund must complete an application form (available at the church office or on the table by the offering plate at the rear of the sanctuary) along with a copy of the Sequanota registration form.

These forms should be returned to the church office on or before April 30 so the Cook Fund Committee can evaluate the request and determine if funding is possible.

Applicants will receive notification of the Committee's decision no later than May 31 so the registration process can be completed in a timely fashion.

Persons who miss the April deadline can still apply through May 31. No applications will be accepted after May 31.

Children who are not members of Trinity Lutheran Church may be granted assistance if and only if financial need is present.


