Summer is winding down. School has started. Things are ongoing at Trinity. First of all, Rally Day is upon us. The new Sunday School year will start on September 10. Our Christian Education program will begin another year. There are opportunities for virtually every age group from pre-school through adult classes to learn and appreciate God's Word. Parents, please consider bringing your children for this VERY important hour every Sunday from 9:30 to 10:30. While you're doing that, stick around for the adult class in Trinity hall. This class is led by Pastor Eli and studies the various books of the Bible and usually includes a lot of "off-topic" discussion.

You noticed that I said "virtually". We currently lack a class for our post-confirmand teens. I taught such a class for quite a few years until I was asked to teach Confirmation class for our 7th and 8th grade youth. Currently, the only opportunity for post-conformation students is to join the adult class I referred to above. The few youth that have done this definitely add a different perspective to these studies. However, I sometimes lament that we don't have a class for this age group (14-18). This is a crucial time for these youngsters, They are faced with the challenges of living in a world that is often confusing, divisive, and downright difficult to live in. When I led such a class, I tried to focus on issues that were important to that age group. My focus was to show how God's Word can sustain us and help us to deal with issues that were unheard of in Biblical times. Young people are important to any church and Trinity is certainly no exception. I'd love to see someone (preferably a 20-30 "something" adult) to offer an educational opportunity to this very VITAL group. Last of all, many of you are aware of Trinity's Endowment Fund. This was created several years ago to invest in Trinity's future. As earnings from this Fund accumulate, we need to make decisions as to how to use them. Also, the policy of this Fund is to set aside 10% of larger contributions for "first fruit" gifts to an ELCA ministry. If you would be interested in playing a part in these decisions, please let Pastor Eli or myself know. Your time and efforts will be greatly appreciated.

Property – Adam reported that he repaired a phone line that fell off the building, no service was interrupted. We passed the fire inspection by replacing an Exit sign on 6 th Street side. New grass has been planted where the old telephone pole was removed. Van is in good condition. Hallway floors have been stripped and refinished. Trinity Hall will be done Friday. He is renting a floor scrubber for \$175.00. Some water came in downstairs after the last downpour. It has been cleaned up. He needs a few more sheets of plywood to finish the Theatre building. Ken Myers said that he has some and would give it to him. He also reported that the lawn mower, weed trimmer, and hedge trimmer are not working, and he is using his equipment. We discussed the lawn equipment and Adam should not have to use his own. Geri will contact Adam to see exactly what is wrong with the equipment. We will table discussing getting a new mower till we have more information.

Old Business

Air Conditioner – the air conditioner is fixed. The problem was the condenser which had a factory defect. Pastor has tried to get a maintenance agreement. Jim will call to see if he can secure one.

Out of the Cold – Pastor Kevin has asked all the Altoona churches to have a Prayer Sanctuary during the winter months. Churches would open one day a week for the homeless to come in overnight to get warm and have a hot drink. Volunteers would man the doors. This would be for one night a week during the months of December through March. Council asked Pastor to invite Pastor Kevin to our next meeting to tell us more about the program.

Judy made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Chris seconded. Motion passed.

The meeting was then adjourned.
