Spafford, on another ship headed to England passed by the spot of the shipwreck and penned the words to the hymn, "It is well with my soul". It amazes me how out of such tragedy something so comforting can come. This song has brought comfort to so many people, including myself. There have been many beautiful things that come out of tragedy. People set up scholarships, organizations raise money, poems are written, songs are song, friendships are made. That does not mean that one wishes for tragedy to occur so something good can come, but that perhaps in the midst of tragedy we might see and feel, and experience the good to comes from others. OCTOBER


